The following downloads are The Advent Kids daily scripture readings for the 25 days of Advent/Christmas. It's a chronological reading that goes from Jesus' birth to the very beginning of his childhood. It is mostly from the books of Luke and Matthew but also includes the story of the wise men, some old testament prophecies and some extra new testament scriptures.

We wanted this scripture reading to walk you through the Christmas story and focus on the heart of why Jesus came in the first place. The heart of Christmas is love- Jesus came because He loves us and one of the greatest ways we can love Him in return is to love and serve other people. Jesus said "we are the light of the world" and what better way to BE the light of the world than to share the heart of Christmas all year long.

1

Isaiah 9:2

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned.

2

Matthew 1:18a

This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about...

Luke 1:26-27

God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary.

Luke 1:28

"The angel (Gabriel) went to [Mary] and said 'Greetings you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you.'"

4

Luke 1:29-30

Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God.'

5

Luke 1:31-33

You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and He will reign over Jacob's descendants forever, his kingdom will never end."

6

Jeremiah 23:5

“The days are coming,” declares the Lord, “when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, a King who will reign wisely and do what is just and right in the land.”

7

Luke 1:38

“I am the Lord’s servant,” Mary answered. “May your word to me be fulfilled.” Then the angel left her.

8

Matthew 1:18b-19

His (Jesus’) mother was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her publicly, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

9

Matthew 1:20-21

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said “Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.”

10

Matthew 1:22-23

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet (Isaiah): “The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel” (which means ‘God with us’).”

11

Matthew 1:24

When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife.

12

Luke 2:1-4

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David.

13

Luke 2:5

He (Joseph) went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.

14

Luke 2:6-7

While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

15

Isaiah 9:6-7

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end.



16

Luke 2:8-12:

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night.

An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, “Don’t be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.”

17

Luke 2:13-14

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly hosts appeared with the angel, praising God and saying: “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth, peace to those on whom his favor rests.”

18

Luke 2:15-20

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let’s go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about.” So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread word concerning what had been told them about this child and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

19

Matthew 2:1-2

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

Numbers 24:17b & 19a:

A star will come out of Jacob....A ruler will come out of Jacob.

20

Matthew 2:3-8:

When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet (Micah) has written: "But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. He sent them to Bethlehem and said "Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him."

21

Matthew 2:9-12:

After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route."

22

Matthew 2:13-15

When they (the Magi) had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up," he said, "take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him." So he got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, where he stayed until the death of Herod. And so was fulfilled what the Lord had said through the prophet (Hosea): "out of Egypt I called my son."

Matthew 2:19-21a, 23

After Herod died, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said "get up, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who were trying take the child's life are dead." So he got up, took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel...and he went and lived in a town called Nazareth. So was fulfilled what was said through the prophets, that he would be called a Nazarene.

23

Luke 2:40, 52

And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him. And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man.



24

John 3:16

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

25

Matthew 5:14-16

(Jesus said) "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on a stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."
